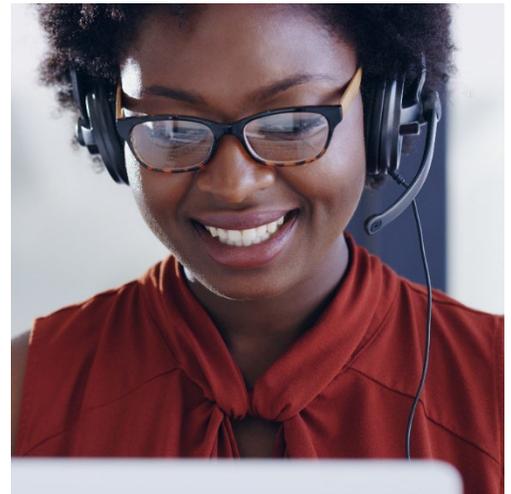
Health Surveillance Training Course

Overview
